## CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a **spectator/parent** at an IAPS sports event, you have a responsibility to:

1. Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
2. Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials and their decisions
3. **Respect the officials and their decisions at all times. Video evidence from spectators will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.**  
Respect the coaches and their decisions, they give their time, energy and experience to coach your children.
4. **Refrain from any form of abuse towards players, officials and fellow spectators.**
5. Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.  
Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
6. Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.
7. Be aware that IAPS events have comprehensive safeguarding policies and procedures, available on our website:

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that **IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event, if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.**



## EVENT INFORMATION

### Minibus Parking

Please drop off players at the Sport Centre (USSC) Coach Park and then park at the Middle. A park and ride service will be operating from the Middle to return you to USSC and again at the end of the day.

### Coach Parking

Please drop off players at the USSC Coach Park and then park towards the top of Leicester Road.

### Car Parking

Limited spectator parking is available in the USSC Coach Park.

### Park and Ride

There will be a 'park and ride' service from the Uppingham Cricket Club in operation throughout the day for spectators once the USSC Coach Park is full.

### Public Car Parks

Public car parks (charges apply Monday - Saturday) are indicated on the map. There is also limited (restrictions in place Monday - Saturday) and unlimited on-street parking in the town.

Complimentary refreshments will be served for competitors and spectators from 9.00 am to 3.00 pm in the USSC Hospitality Suite. We ask that players bring a packed lunch.

# RULES AND REGULATIONS

## Tournament Rules:

- The Tournament will be run under IFNA Rules.
- All teams are to be 7-aside and use size 5 balls with the height of the posts at 10ft.
- Umpires are not allowed to officiate their own teams or other teams from their school,
- Inexperienced umpires must not officiate any of the matches as we must try to have a high standard of umpiring, (ideally equivalent to a 'C' umpire).

## Competition:

- A central hooter will sound at the start, half-time and end of matches but the umpires must use their whistle to start and finish play.
- At half-time umpires must start their matches immediately after teams have changed ends, substitutions may be made but **no** team talk.
- Please refer to the playing schedule for the length of matches.
- All playing schedules allow for the 3<sup>rd</sup> placed section teams to be included in the "play-off" stages.
- Golden goal rule will be used in the knock out stages of the 'play-offs'. (On hearing the final hooter and when the score line is equal the umpires should not stop play but allow it to continue until the next goal has been scored.)


## Scoring

- 5 points – win
- 3 points – draw
- 1 point for scoring 50% or more of the winning teams score.

## Ties

The group order will be decided by the number of points scored by each team. In the event of a tie on points the following will decide final placings in the group stages:

- Goal difference
- Total goals scored
- Result between the two teams



In the event of a draw in the knock out stages, the winner will be decided by extra time. There should be a 2-minute interval after full time before starting the extra time. The extra time will be 5 mins one way.

If the score is still tied after 5 minutes extra time, then a period of golden goal will commence. The first team to score a goal wins the match.

### Captains

- Should toss for first centre pass or choice of goal end well before the start of play and have their team ready to go on court immediately the preceding match has finished.
- Only the teams playing and their official coaches and reserves should be on the courts.
- Reserves/team coaches must stay at the same end throughout matches
- Failure to comply with this rule will have offenders banned to the outside of the courts for the remainder of the tournament.
- Only umpires should be down the middle of the court.
- This is important as it allows organisers to see if there is a problem.
- Parents, other players' and staff must be on the outside of the courts.

### Late Arrivals

- No team shall start a match with less than 5 players
- Late arrivals may not enter the game whilst play is in progress until allowed by the umpire *after a goal has been scored*.
- If any team fails to arrive on time or with less than five players, the match will be void and 5 points awarded to the team present.
- Umpires must clearly mark the scorecards accordingly.
- No extra time will be allowed - in the case of an accident/injury, please immediately substitute a player who cannot continue.

### Tournament Procedures:

- Please report to the Organisers at least 30 mins before start of play.
- Please check your start time very carefully both as the playing team and as an umpire.
- If you are placed to qualify yet know that you cannot commit to the Finals, please let the organisers at your tournament know on the day.

### Cancellation:

Lack of time means only extreme weather conditions will cancel the tournaments.
